ADMISSIONS OPEN

FG Degree College Kamra Cantt announces admissions to 1st Year Pre-Med, Pre-Eng and ICS for students who secured 75% or above marks based on their Class 9 results. As per the policy of the Regional Office Wah Cantt, the FG Education Institutions (FGEI) Wah Region will award the *cash prizes* to the following students:

Rs. 100,000 to students who achieve top positions in the Federal Board.

Rs. 50,000 to students who secure 1050 marks or above.

Rs. 15000 along with a full fee waiver to students securing above 990 marks.

Rs. 10,000 to students obtaining 90% or above marks in the Federal Board's First Year Exam based on their hard work and excellent performance under the "Seasonal Scholarships" program, to be held twice a year. This includes full fee waivers as well.

Rs. 50,000 will go to the Top scorers in Pre-Medical, Pre-Engineering, ICS, and Arts

Similarly, STREAMS will receive a cash prize of Rs. 50,000.

Considering these incentives, classes have already commenced in all three colleges of Wah Cantt, while classes at FG Degree College Kamra Cantt will commence very soon.

Pakistan Aeronautical Complex Kamra stands as a center of excellence, its crucial role in safeguarding our cherished homeland affirmed during the recent "Marka e Haq". Thousands of devoted professionals at this esteemed institution deserve our deepest gratitude, heartfelt tributes and countless prayers for their unwavering service.

It's a matter of pride that we have been endowed with a chance to serve this prestigious institution. Nestled within the residential enclave of the Avionics Production Factory (APF), FG Degree College, Kamra stands as a symbol of academic aspiration and dedication.

Since its inception in 2007 the institution has steadily grown, evolving from a modest facility within the FG Boys Public School to its own purpose-built campus. Today, it operates under the stewardship of the FGEI Directorate, Rawalpindi, serving as a vital center of learning in the region.

The college is affiliated with the Federal Board of Intermediate & Secondary Education, Islamabad and the National University of Pakistan for BS programs.

Although BS classes are yet to begin due to infrastructural limitations, the foundation has been laid for future academic expansion.


At Intermediate Level the college offers admissions in Pre-Engineering, Pre-Medical, and Computer Science programs.

Presently a total of 248 students are enrolled. Presently a total of 248 students are enrolled.

Prior to routine admissions process for all students, For the first time, new admissions have been started on 9th-Grade Performance as per the 2025 policy of Regional Office Wah.

The College is equipped with Classrooms, Fully Functional State of the Art Science Laboratories along with a newly Established High Tech Smart Class Room through HEC funding and a Library equipped with books for grooming the students both socially and academically.

A newly constructed Cafeteria is set to open in the coming academic session.







Apart from academics the college has a Basket Ball Court and Lush Green Playgrounds and Sitting Benches with Sheds to provide a conducive environment for mental health of the students.

Examination & Admission office has been set up for smoothly running the student's assessment (Internal Exams), enrolment of students and correspondence with the FBISE and Admission Process.

For Teaching Staff there are Separate Staff Rooms for Male and Female Faculty members.

Set against the backdrop of the Pakistan Aeronautical Complex (PAC), a prestigious formation, the college benefits from a setting known for excellence.

However, the realities of Teaching and Administration at Kamra present unique challenges such as:

The Teaching and Non-Teaching staff, despite their critical roles, face the hardships of Limited Residence, inadequate Medical Facilities and stringent Security Protocols.

Employees are required to obtain security clearance from their hometown Police and District Police Offices (DPOs) for Issuing Entry Passes which often causes significant delays and frustration owing to the cumbersome procedure.

Even after a rigorous recruitment process, most of the faculty members face daily barriers to reach the workplace—damping morale and productivity.

A recent improvement, following communication with PAF's security office, has resulted in annual entry passes replacing the previously issued monthly ones.


However, access remains difficult for parents and prospective students. Student's admission process is slowed by security protocols that require written permission from the principal, leaving visitors waiting at the Colony Gate. Consequently, the College Prospectus and admissions are being distributed outside the PAC Entry Gates instead of the College Campus for Several Years.

Simplifying the Entry System during Admissions, PTMs and Infrastructure work can profoundly enhance the College's functioning. Developmental works delays are often tied to the restricted access of labourers and are restricted to vacate the premises by 4 PM sharply. Such obstacles hamper growth and discourage both Staff and Stakeholders.

Most of the PAF and PAC officers opt to enroll their wards in PAF-run institutions (Fazaia Colleges), Leaving FG Degree College to serve students from the surrounding areas such as Hazro, Kamra Village, Qutba Village and outskirts of the Attock City.

Accommodation for the faculty remains a pressing concern.

PAC authorities do not extend residential (Neither Bachelor nor Family) and Healthcare support to the college community.



Principal Dr. Asad Mustafa has been tirelessly working to address these systemic issues, offering a ray of hope for long-term improvement. In his leadership all his team members and subordinates are enthusiastic to perform to the best of their abilities so that the Institution may thrive and shine. Despite the challenges and scare resources, every co-curricular activity is given due consideration to fulfill the objectives of learning.

A barrack allocated for FG Staff by the AMF provides a dormitory type of accommodation for Six Lecturers and One Assistant Professor, where the conditions are humble and fail to conform to their professional stature.

Furthermore, the College has seen a rapid turnover of Principals—mostly served for less than Three Years—mainly due to the lack of amenities and housing. Typically posted from Wah Cantt or Rawalpindi. They often request transfers soon after assuming their roles.

Yet, despite these difficulties, FG Degree College Kamra retains a quiet strength in its simplicity. Small in scale but rich in spirit, the campus is enveloped by natural beauty and a calm environment that nurtures learning and inspiration. It is a place where the pursuit of knowledge persists against all odds.

May this institution continue to thrive with dignity and purpose. May its faculty be granted the comfort and support they deserve so that they may impart wisdom with vigor. And may its students rise with brilliance, bringing honor to their families and glory to the nation. It is our firm belief that the future years will see our institution as the epitome of glory.
